Installation

If appropriate shielding or eye protection is not available, turn on the light only at a safe distance or in the area that is not directly exposed to the light when installing or maintaining the device.

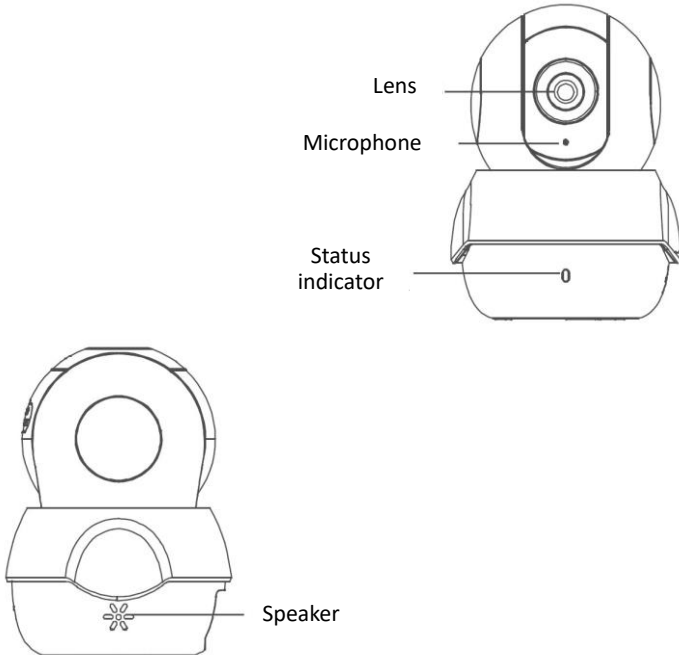
Emergency

If smoke, odor, or noise arises from the device, immediately turn off the power, unplug the power cable, and contact the service center.

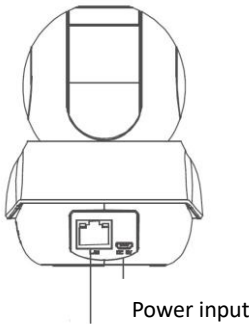
Time Synchronization

Set up device time manually for the first time access if the local time is not synchronized with that of the network. Visit the device via web browser/client software and go to time settings interface.

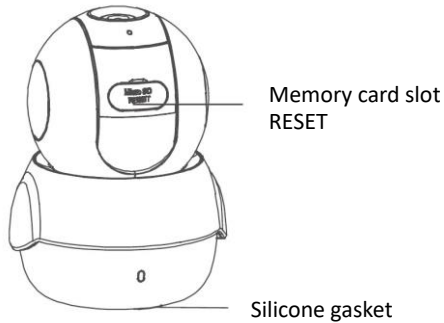

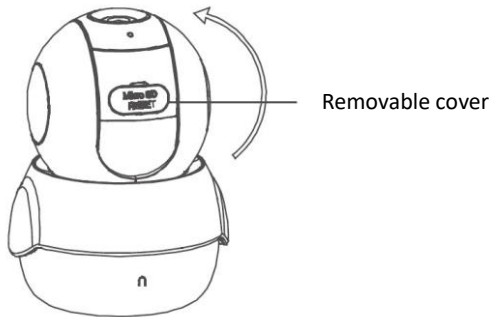


Name	Description
Power input	Micro USB for power supply, 5 VDC. Plug the power cable into the power input interface to power on the camera.
Memory card slot	For microSD card. If a memory card is used, video files will be stored in the memory card. You would need to initialize it in the Guarding Vision app.
RESET	Hold down the button for 4 seconds when the camera is running.

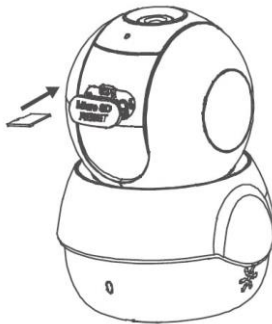
2 Installation

2.1 Install the Memory Card

1. Adjust the tilting position of the camera to expose the removable cover.



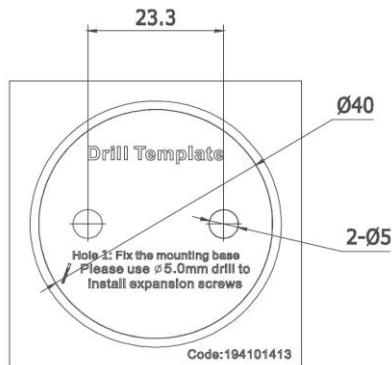
2. Open the cover to expose the memory card slot and insert the memory card.



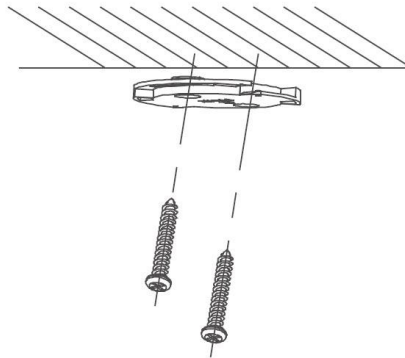
3. Re-install the cover.

2.2 Install the Camera

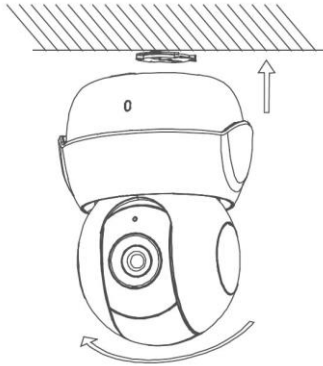
1. Take out the drill template from the package. Paste it to the desired mounting place.
2. Drill two screw holes according to the drill template if you use expansion screws.



3. Take out the adapter from the package. Align the screw holes and fix the adapter.

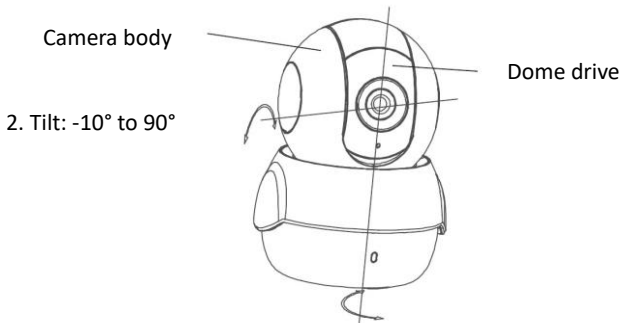


4. Fix the adapter into the camera bottom and rotate the camera base clockwise to get it fixed.



2.3 Adjust the Surveillance Angle

1. Rotate the camera body to adjust the panning position.
2. Move the dome drive upwards or downwards to adjust the tilting position.

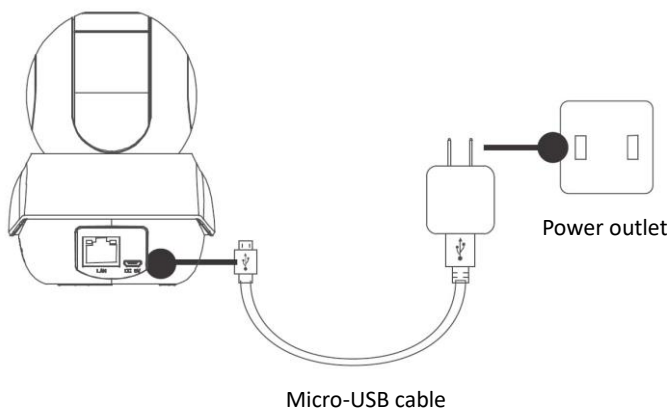

3 Operation

3.1 Power On the Camera

Connect the camera to the power adapter with the micro-USB cable and then plug the power adapter into the power outlet. When the blue light flashes, the camera is powered on. You can set the Wi-Fi connection.



3.2 Guarding Vision Setup

1. Connect your mobile device to Wi-Fi.
2. Download and install the Guarding Vision app by searching "Guarding Vision" in the App Store or Google Play™. If you want to use the AP function, download Guarding Vision 3.10.0 or above.

3. Launch the app and register for a Guarding Vision user account.

3.3 Add the Camera to Your Guarding Vision Account

NOTE: Start the adding process only when the indicator flashes blue.

1. Connect your mobile phone to a Wi-Fi (5G Wi-Fi is not supported yet).
2. Log into the Guarding Vision app.
3. In the Home page, tap “+” on the upper-right corner to add a camera.
4. Scan the QR code on the bottom of the camera.
5. Follow the prompts to set the network connection and add the camera to your Guarding Vision account. (Locate the camera within 3 meters from the router when setting up the Wi-Fi.)

4 Guarding Vision

With the Guarding Vision service, you will be able to use the functions of this product (including, but not limited to, live view, and remote playback), which depend on the Internet and telecom value-added services.



4.1 Live View

Launch the Guarding Vision app and to enter the live view of the connected devices.

4.2 Recording

1. Check the memory card status by tapping on the Storage Status in the Device Settings interface.
2. If the memory card status displays as Uninitialized, tap to initialize it. The status will then change to Normal. You can then start recording any event-triggered video in the camera such as motion detection.

4.3 Playback

Launch the Guarding Vision app, tap a connected device and tap the Gallery button to play back.

4.4 Alarm Notification

Launch the Guarding Vision app and tap Message to see the alarm messages.



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
